Dr. Glass explained that policy governing the guidance of non-profit organizations and their purpose of service to the community. He discussed the skills of community leaders.

 - o Increased use of school facilities and encourage success in citizenship, positive attitudes, and enrichment.
 - o Increased enrichment and meaning for the "wide variety of life choices."
- Human Resources Director Nora Klewais promoted citizen characteristics that support youth development organizations and multiple associations.

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
School Board President Kelly Bashaw thanked the group for coming and participating in the linkage and offered tours of the school.
